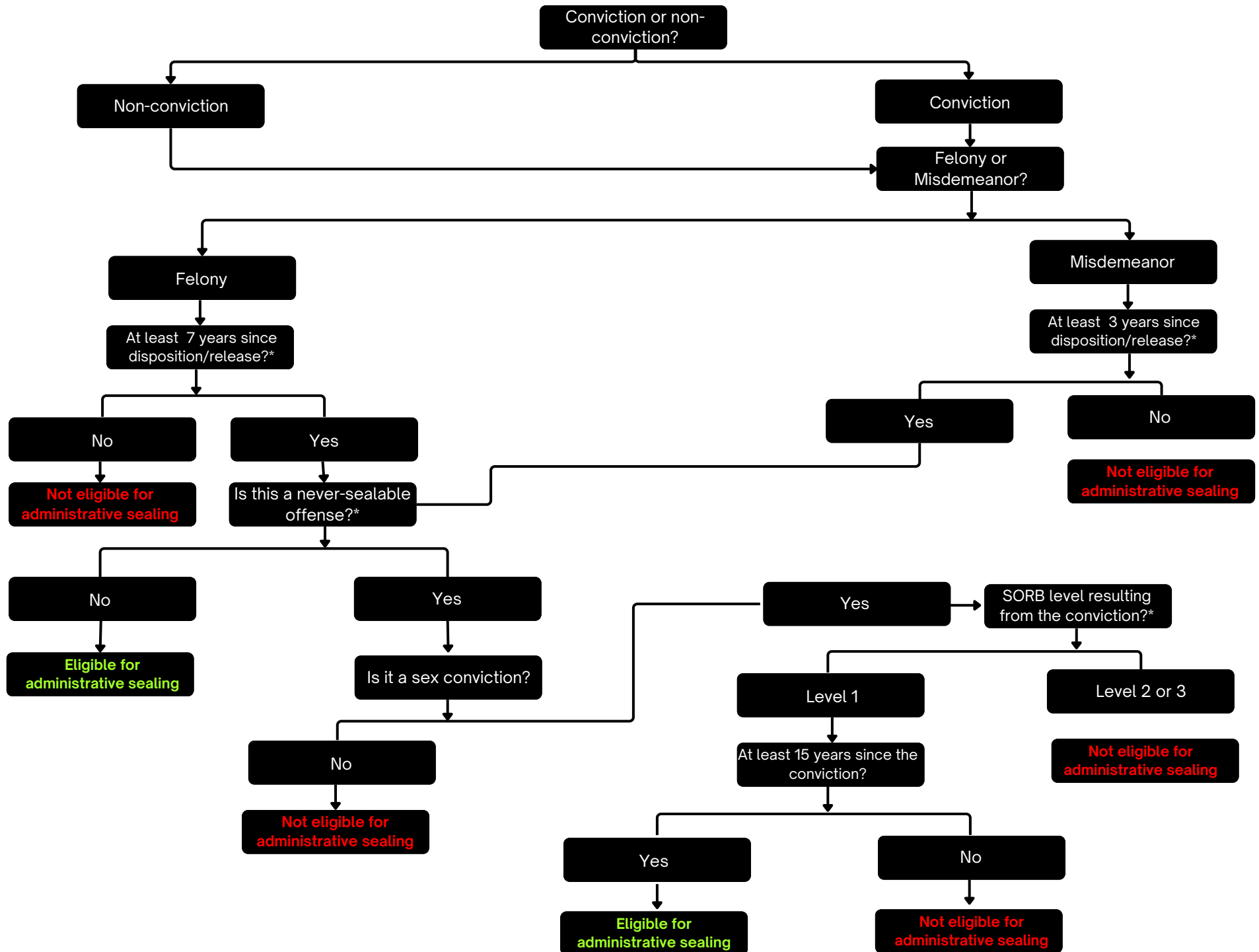


# CORI SEALING FLOW CHART

# CORI SEALING FLOW CHART DEFINITIONS

Explanations for indicated terms

## **\*Disposition/Release:**

To administratively seal a criminal record, a waiting period after the most recent conviction must have elapsed without any additional convictions or incarcerations. The waiting period begins after the date the client was released from jail or prison or after the disposition date.

## **\*Never-Sealable Offenses:**

Some offense are never eligible for sealing, including most convictions with regard to MGL c. 268-268A (except resisting arrest), firearm convictions with regard to MGL c. 140 §§ 12I-13IH, and sex convictions resulting in the classification of a Level 2 or 3 sex offender by the Sex Offender Registry Board (SORB).

## **\*SORB Level:**

SORB stands for the Sex Offender Registry Board. Sex convictions resulting in the classification of a Level 1 sex offender by SORB may be sealed, but have a waiting period of 15 years. Sex convictions resulting in the classification of a Level 2 or 3 sex offender by SORB are not eligible for administrative sealing.
